2013: A year of action, recognition and progress.

Developed in 1985, MetroWest is one of Orlando's first masterplanned communities. From the beginning, the MetroWest Master Association (MWMA) has been dedicated to creating a community in which people would be proud to live, work and visit.

This commitment is reflected in the quality features and amenities MetroWest is known for, such as award-winning landscaping, MetroWest Golf Club, excellent public schools, convenient access to Orlando's downtown and attractions, and of course, the diverse range of desirable living options, from single-family homes of all sizes to apartments and condominiums.

Building on and maintaining the high quality of life MetroWest is known for is an on-going commitment. In 2013, important strides were made on the road of continuous improvement. Meanwhile, the community's public safety and security program received a prestigious statewide award in recognition of a strong commitment to public safety.

In addition to MetroWest community accolades, MWMA Community Manager Julie Sanchez, was showered with many awards for her contributions. In April of 2013, Julie Sanchez received the elite 2013 statewide Manager of Excellence Award from the Florida Communities of Excellence, one of only four managers statewide acknowledged. The year ended with two more awards as the overall winner of the 2013 Spirit of First Service Award, awarded through management company First Service Residential, and a winner of the 2013 West Orange Chamber of Commerce George Bailey Award. These awards reflect the competence and commitment of Julie's management of the MWMA.

This was proven again in 2013, a year that saw a robust influx of new businesses into the community, including Marco's Pizza, First Choice Pediatrics, the Mathnasium Math Learning Center, Weight Watchers, Café Murano, the Cheesesteak Factory and more.

At the same time, established MetroWest businesses such as Life Worth Living Pharmacy expanded their operations here. Throughout the year, MWMA sponsored Business Owners/Managers Roundtable meetings to encourage business and community leaders to "Share the Good News" about MetroWest. The community also hosted events such as Best Fest 2013, SummerFest and WinterFest, which provided excellent opportunities for businesses to showcase their products and services. MetroWest offers an excellent location and environment for business success, and it shows in the strength and vibrancy of its ever-growing business community.

In 2013 increasing communications became a priority with the enhancement

Community upgrades and renovations.

Maintaining a quality environment and infrastructure in MetroWest is an ongoing priority for MWMA, and several key projects were undertaken in 2013. In August 2013 MWMA launched the \$1.7 million MetroWest irrigation upgrade project, replacing the community's original irrigation system with a brand new one that is truly state-of-the-art. The new, eco-friendly system brings MetroWest into compliance with the City of Orlando's guidelines for water management. In addition, its water conservation technology will save a substantial amount of money over time. The irrigation project is an integral part of MetroWest's future and will further the community's reputation as one of Orlando's best places to live.

MetroWest Golf Club, the home of a Robert Trent Jones, Sr., Signature Course, is well established as one of Orlando's premier public golfing experiences. This past year, the course underwent a \$1.5 million renovation to make the game faster and more enjoyable for everyday golfers. The project included resurfacing of all greens, bunker renovations, laser leveling and resurfacing of all tee boxes, and the expansion of the practice facilities with a new teeing area. "We are very excited to undertake this course renovation project at MetroWest and further enhance what has long been considered an unmatched Orlando golfing experience," said MetroWest Golf Club General Manager Steve Schaller.

Projects such as the irrigation upgrade and golf course renovation are investments that benefit all residents by enhancing the beauty and appeal of MetroWest.
